The Village Marching Band 1922

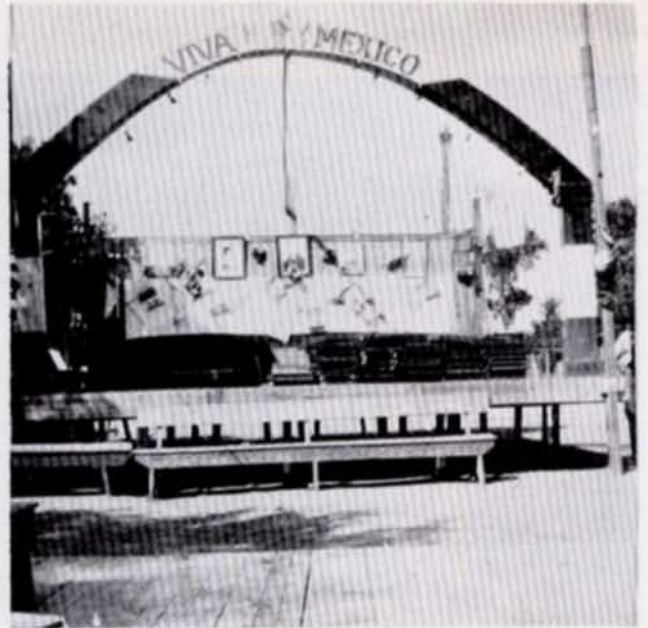

The Village marching band participated in the Dodge City Semi-Centennial Pageant on October 11, 1922.



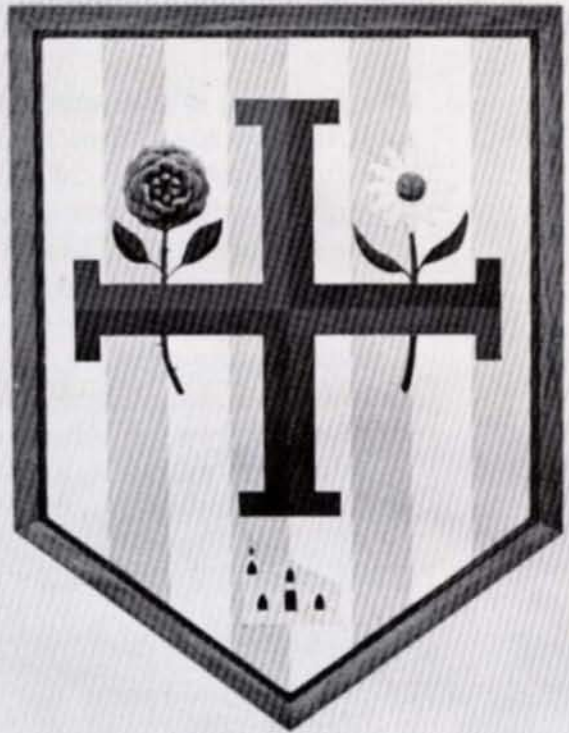
Tony Rodriguez as Coronado before a 1931 parade

This plaque, purchased by a parishioner in Mexico City in 1975, hangs in the parish center.



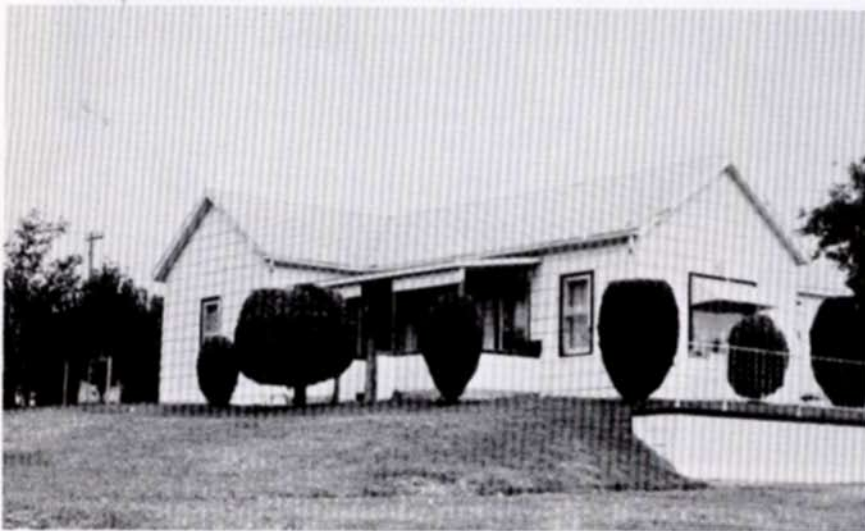
The parish insignia was designed for the 60th anniversary of the parish by Dennis Burghart, Father David Kraus and Father Eugene Sloan. The vertical stripes are blue and silver taken from the United States flag; the cross is red and green from the flag of Mexico. The rose of Guadalupe, the Kansas sunflower and the facade of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church are also depicted.
