RITE OF CONFIRMATION

Presentation of Candidates

After the Gospel, the pastor, deacon or catechist introduces the candidates for confirmation. See "Part II: Sacrament of Confirmation Guidelines" for the formula.

Renewal of Baptismal Promises

After the homily the candidates stand and the Bishop leads the candidates in the renewal of baptismal promises. The candidates respond with "I do." The renewal is concluded by the Bishop saying the formula, "...this is the faith of the Church..."

Laying on of Hands

The candidates kneel while the Bishop extends his hands in prayer over the candidates.

Anointing with Chrism

The Bishop will stand to administer the sacrament. See "Confirmation Guidelines" for further information about logistics and music.

General Intercessions: *No more than a total of eight intercessions*
