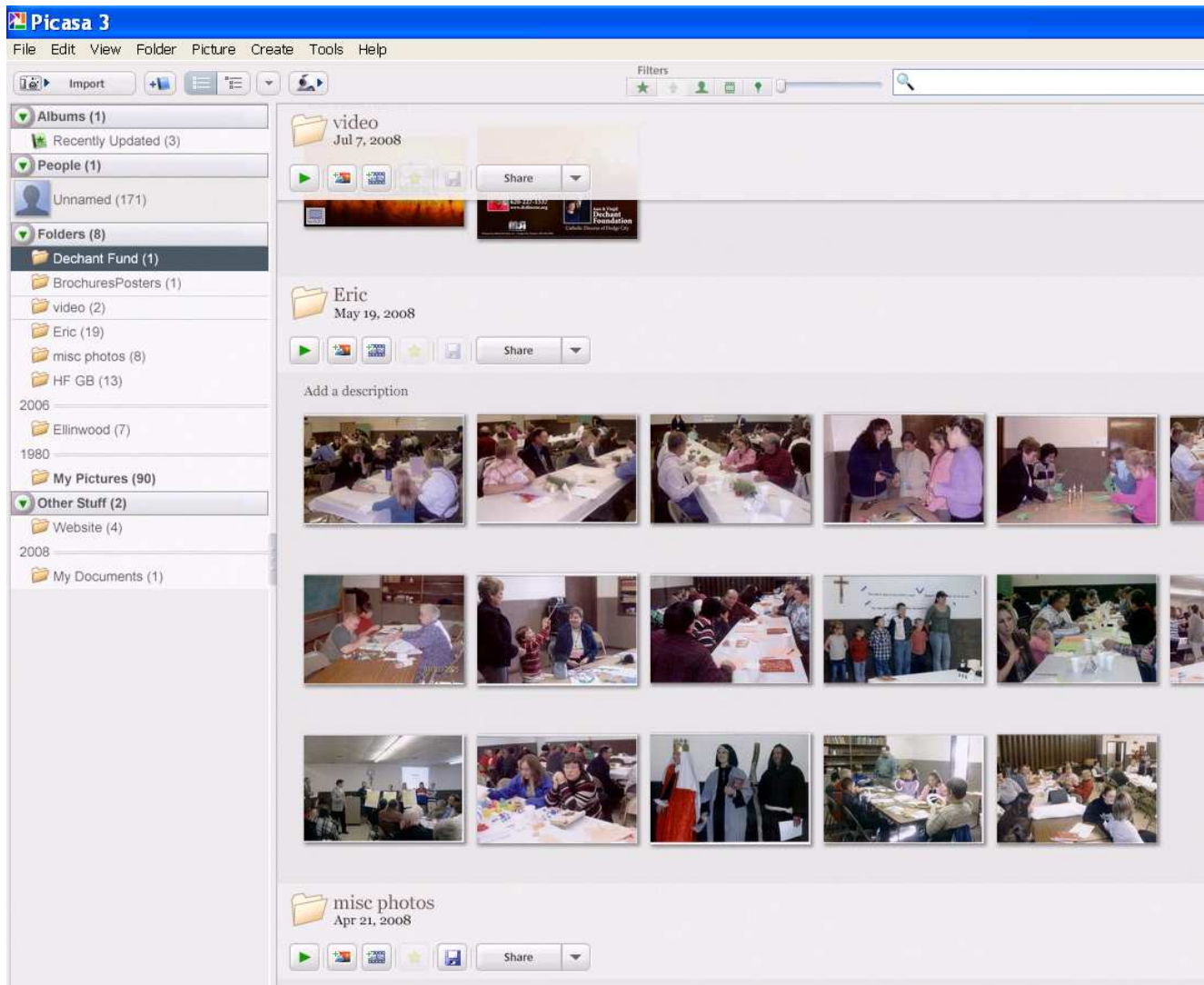


## New easier way to upload photo albums.

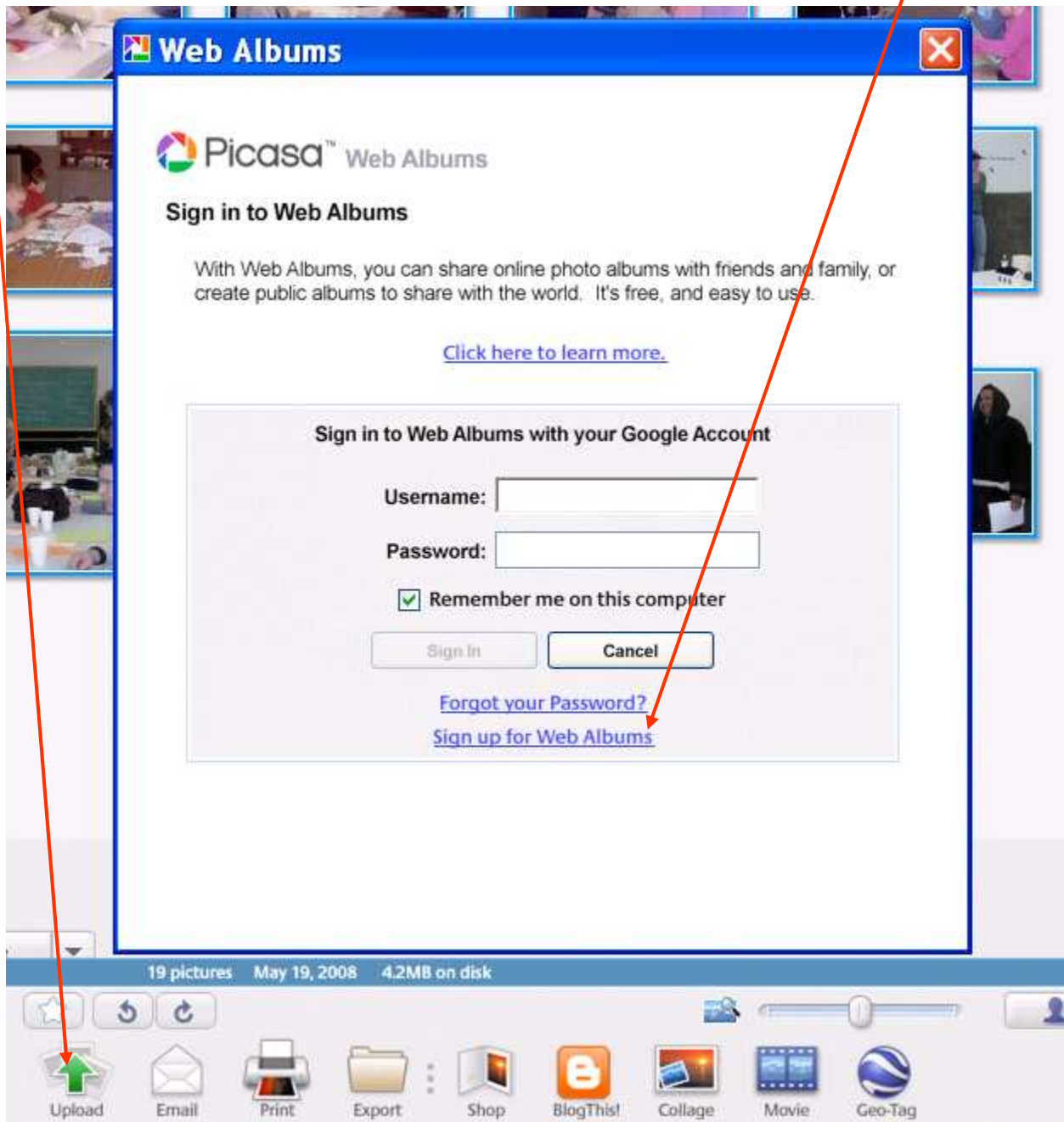
#1. If you do not have Picasa photo editor loaded your PC, download and install the latest version by clicking the link. <http://picasa.google.com/>

#2. Once installed, open Picasa photo editor. It should automatically scan your PC for images.

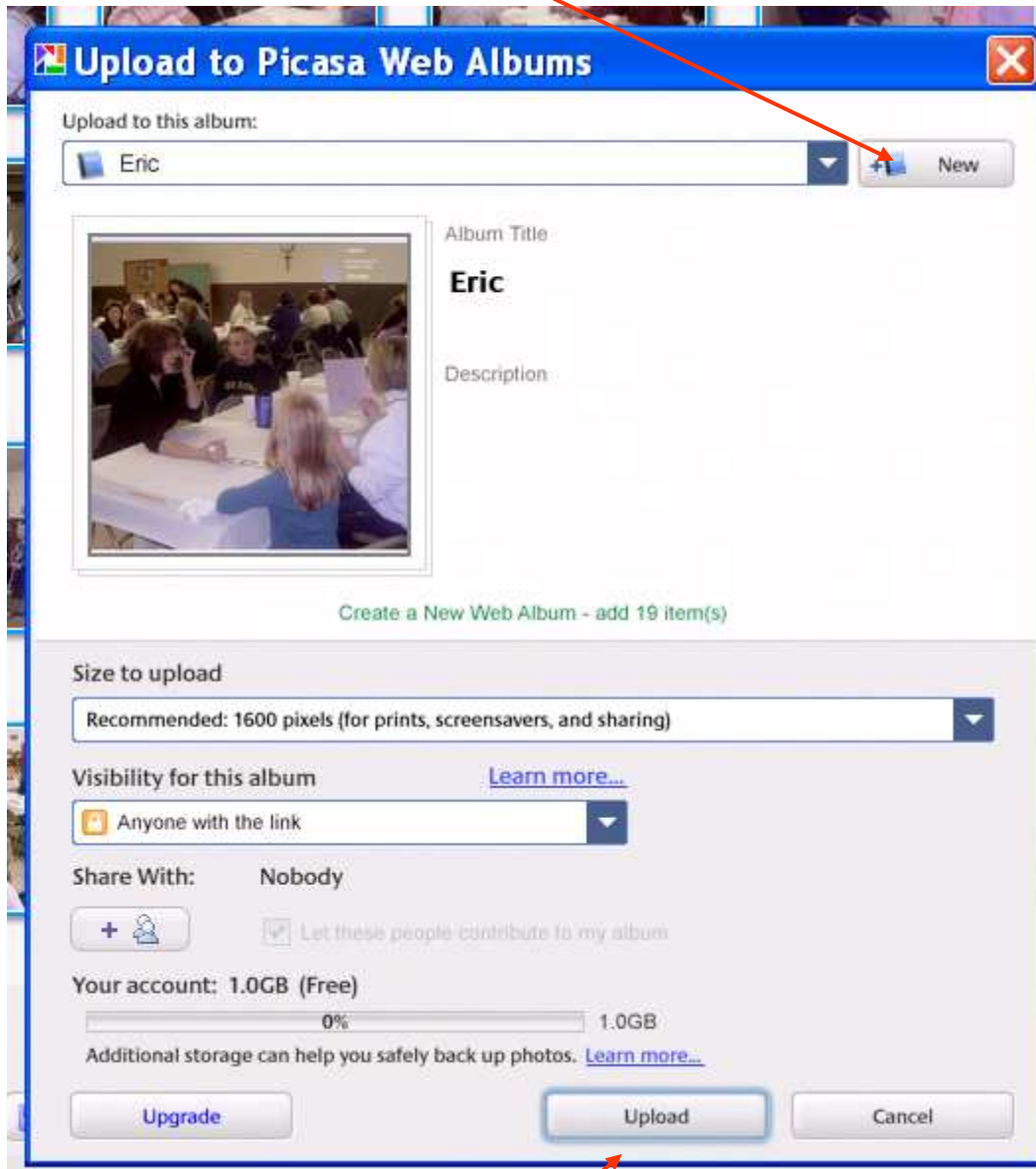
The images will be arranged by folder title or date. Select the images you want to make an album with.



Once you have the images you like selected, click on the upload button at the bottom of the screen. The web albums window pops up. If you do not have a **free** web album, sign up for one and log in. If you subscribe, just log in.

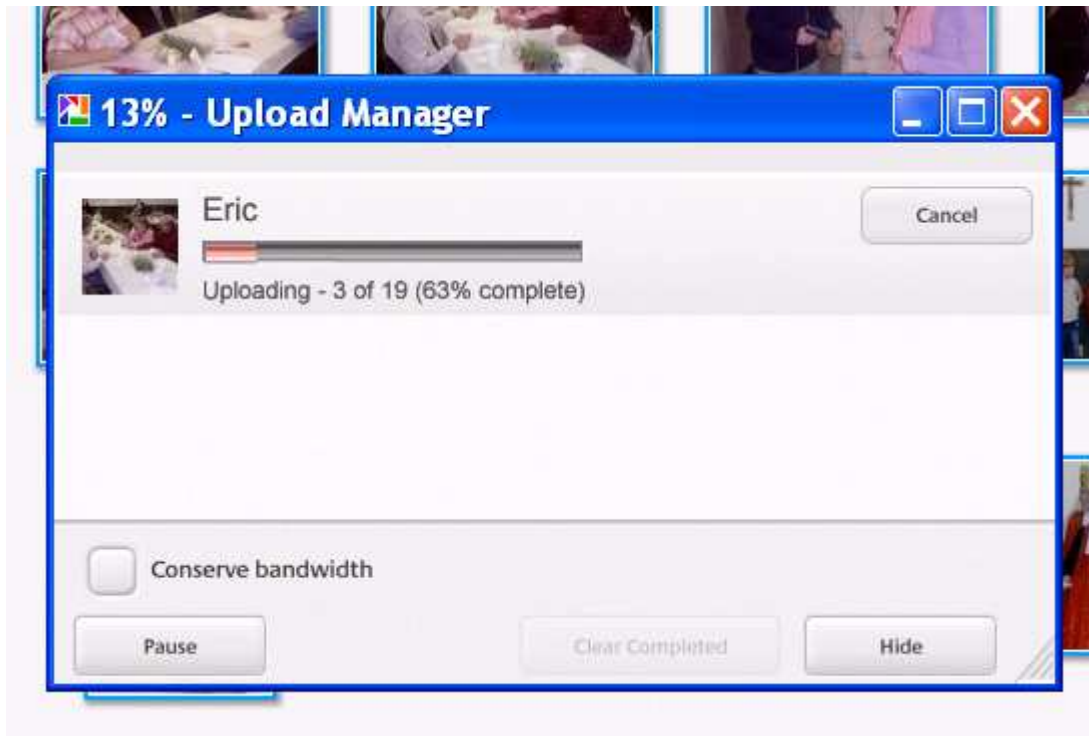


This is the next window to pop up. Here, you change the name of the album and add a description by clicking here

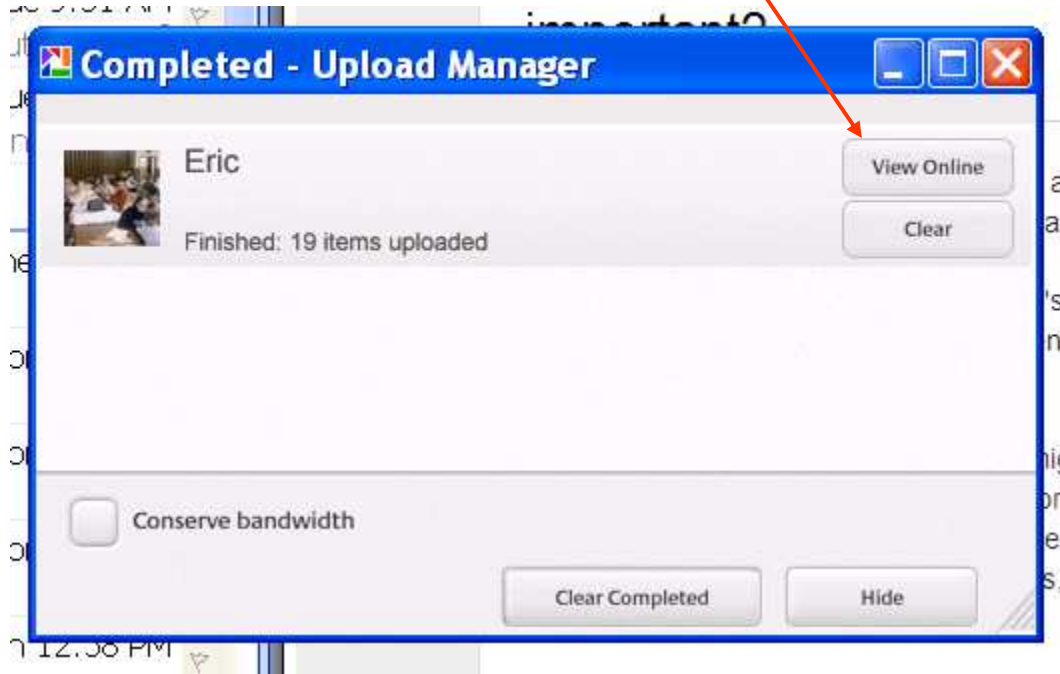


When you are finished with the step above. Click Upload

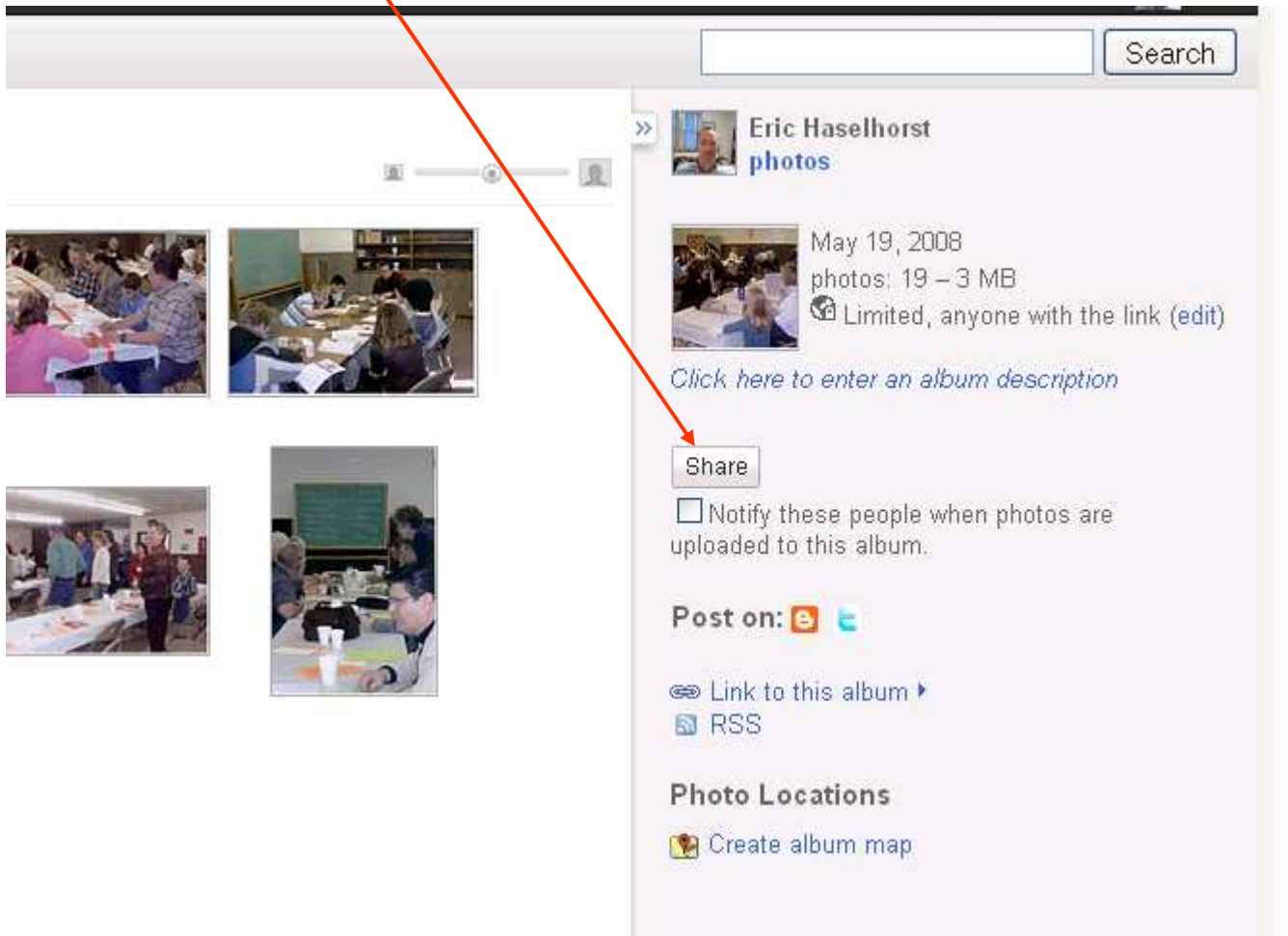
Once Upload has been clicked, this status bar pops up, wait until the process is completed.



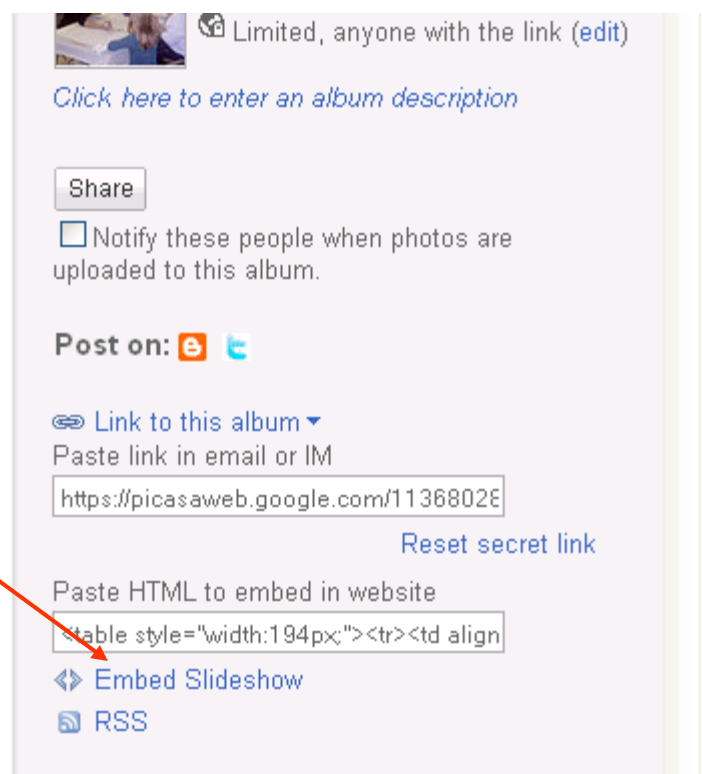
The complete view of the process above. Now, click View Online



Your screen will now show the photo album online Picasa album. To share this album on your webpage. Click on Share



More menu options will pop up.  
Select, Embed Slideshow

Highlight all the HTML code, right click and copy. Then, select done.

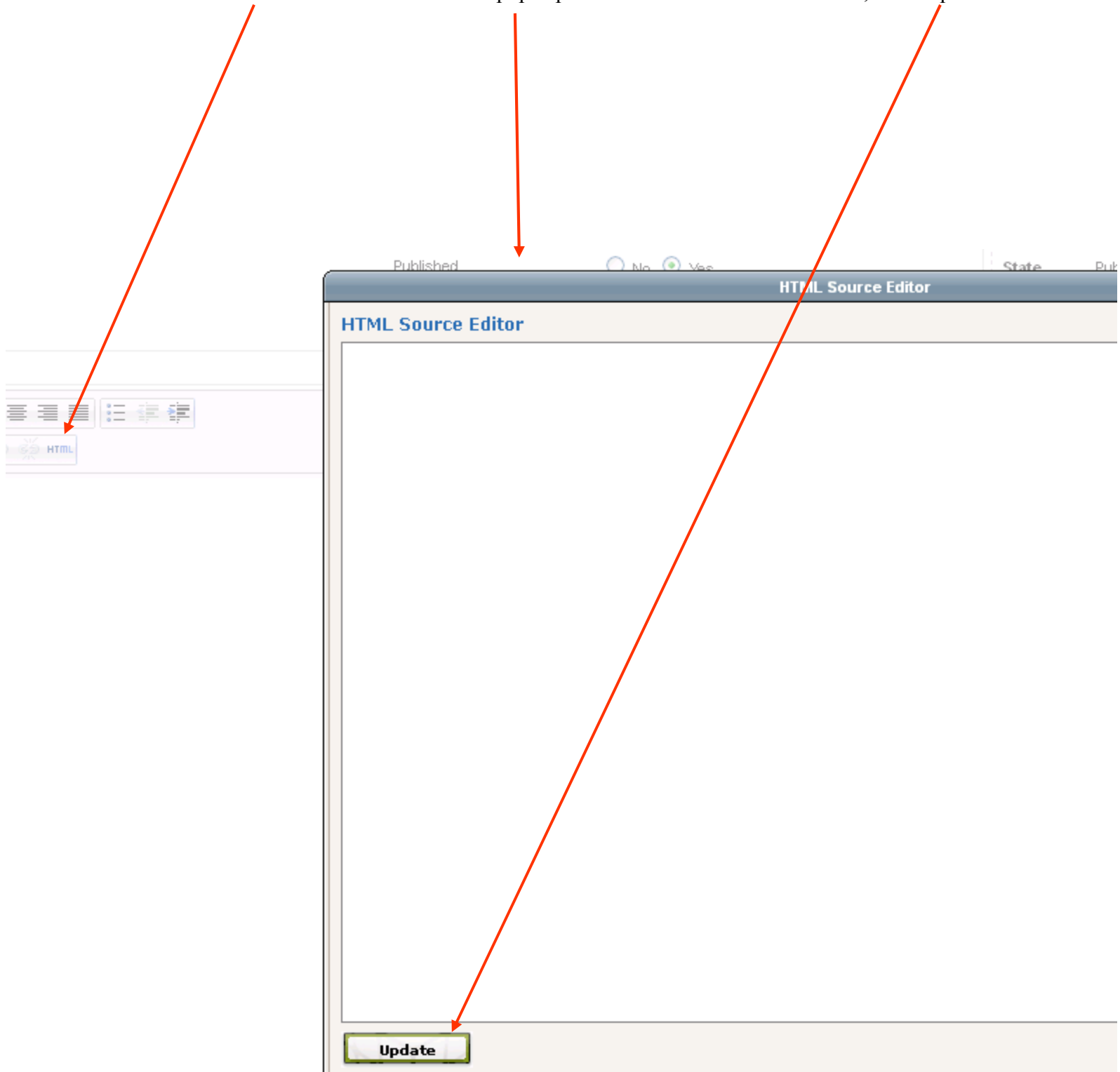
