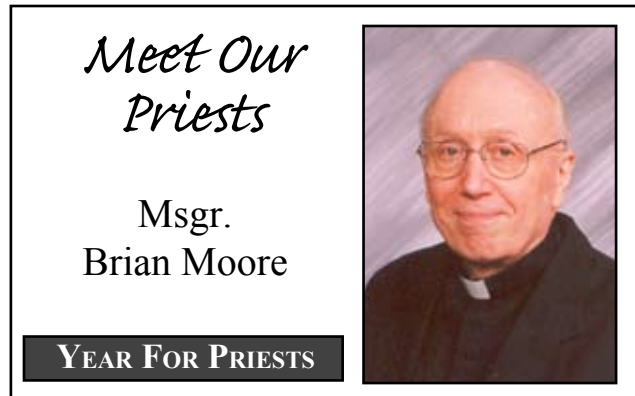


Msgr. Brian Moore:
