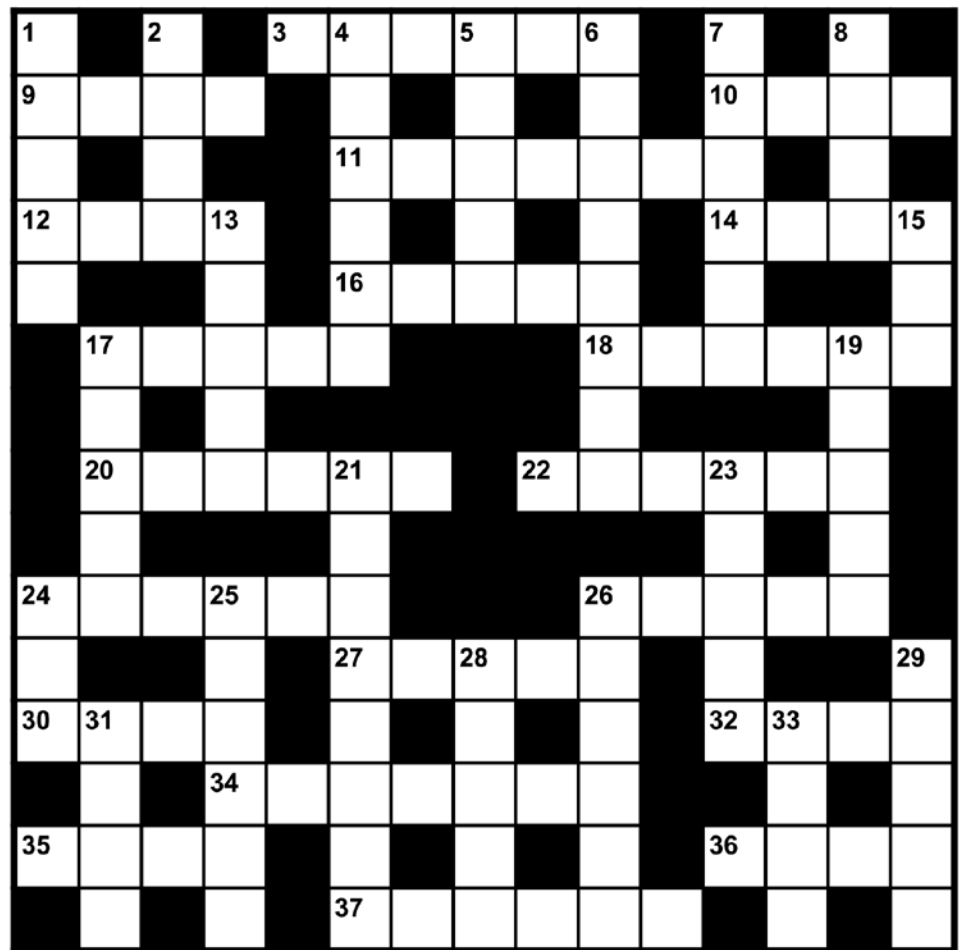
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ST. HUBERT'S CATHOLIC SODUKO

If there are more than 250 but less than 350 socks in total, and if there are more red socks than green socks, what color sock was lost?

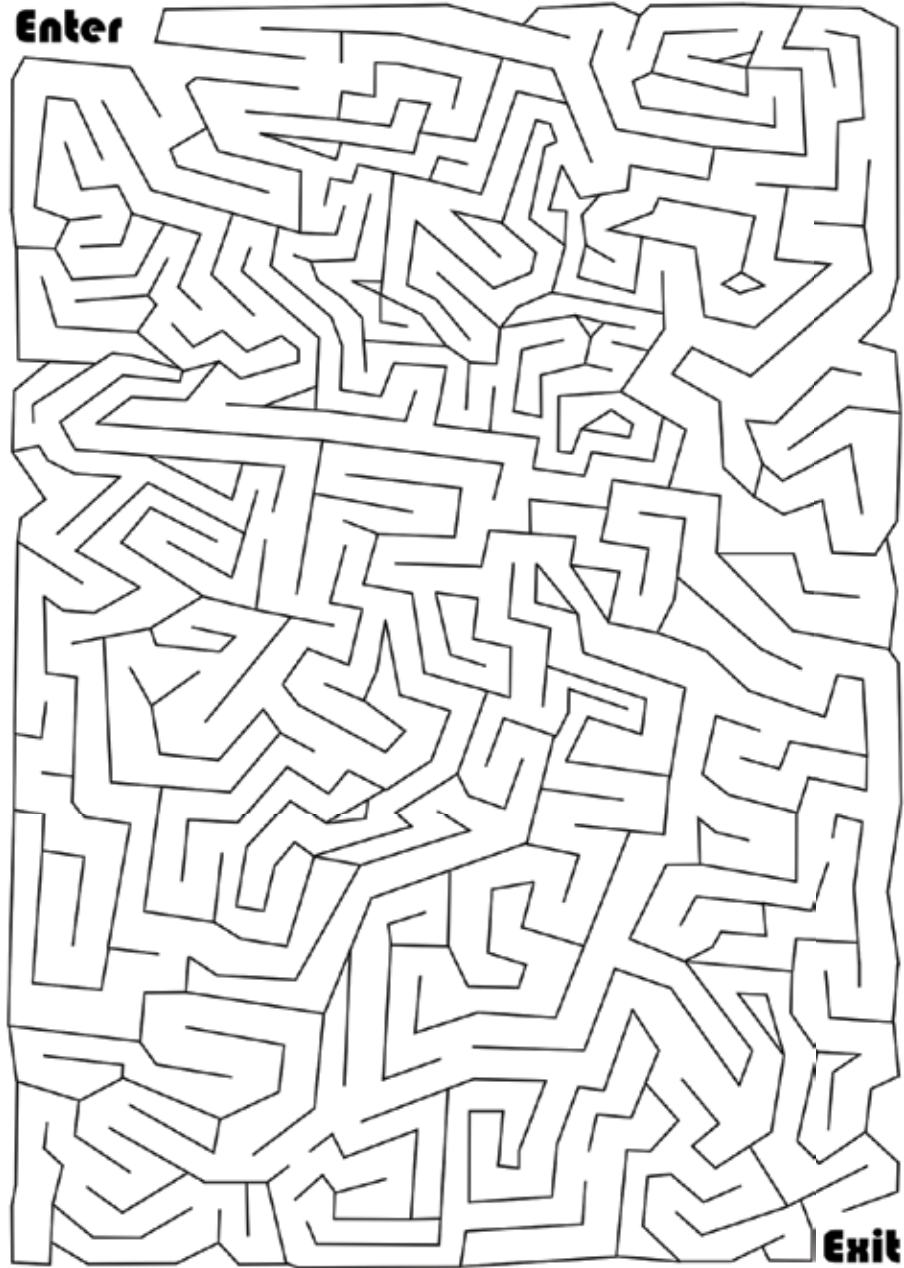

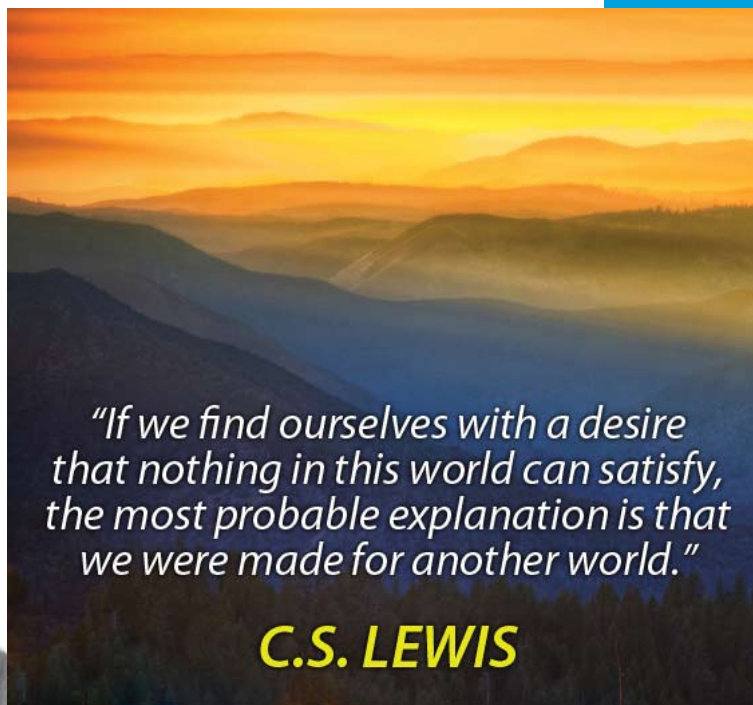
